

The size of the septic tank and length of drain and the depth, size and material of the filtering shall be approved by the Shelby County Health Department or its duly authorized representatives. The City Building Inspector is prohibited from issuing a building permit for construction to any person, firm, or corporation where sanitary sewers are not available unless the applicant for such a permit has complied with the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR. No health permit shall be issued by the Shelby County Health Department for the construction of a pit privy type of disposal unless the property upon which it is to be constructed is of sufficient size and the soil is of such type as to meet the existing regulations governing the construction of septic tanks for disposal of human waste. No health permit can be issued for construction on premises which cannot be adapted to water-borne sewage disposal at a future date.

SECTION FIVE. In the case of the failure of any person, firm, association, corporation, or their agent, in the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance within fifteen (15) days after written notice, the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama may order and execute the necessary improvements, the costs of the same to be assessed against and to become alien upon the entire property or premise upon which such installation or improvements are made, in accordance with Section 606, Chapter 13, of the Code of Alabama of 1940.

SECTION SIX. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate, neglect or refuse to comply with any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) for each offense, and each day that a violation is continued shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION SEVEN. Should any section, clause or provision of this ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not effect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or of any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.

A regular meeting of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, was held in the office of the Town Clerk in Wilsonville, Alabama, the regular place of holding meetings for said Council on the 4 day of November, 1957, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. and there were present at said meeting, Austin Mitchell, Mayor, and the following Councilmen: D. F. Bolton, G. W. Rayfield, V. J. Fulmer, S. S. McEwen, R. G. Weaver, the same constituting a quorum.

Councilman D. F. Bolton introduced the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 10A

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. That all persons, firms, corporations who shall engage in or carry on any of the trades, businesses or professions hereinafter prescribed or who shall keep, carry on or be engaged in keeping or carrying on any of the trades, businesses, professions or establishments, or to do any of the acts hereinafter specified within the corporate limits of the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, on or after the 1st day of January and before January 1st of the following year, shall first pay a license tax for the privilege of engaging in or carrying on said trade, business, profession or establishment or for doing such acts of business within the corporate limits of said Town, and procure a license therefor, such trades, businesses, professions, establishments or acts, and the license therefor shall be as follows:

INSURANCE, the term "Insurance companies," as used in this Ordinance, shall be construed in the same manner and to the same extent as provided in Schedule 59, Section 361 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Alabama, approved September 15, 1919. (a) For doing business in the town of Wilsonville, during each year, until amended or repealed, except as hereinafter provided, by agents or otherwise, each fire or marine insurance company shall pay as a privilege license or tax, four per cent (4%) of the gross premiums, less return premiums, on property located in said town on policies issued during the year, provided, that such percentage shall not exceed four dollars (\$4.00) on each hundred dollars (\$100.00) and major fraction thereof, such gross premiums, and no deduction of credit of any kind shall be allowed or made on account or because of reinsurance by said company in a company not authorized to do business in said town; provided that any company which has not done business in said town for the preceding year shall pay as a privilege license or license tax for the year, subject to adjustment at the end of the year, on the basis or percentages above mentioned on account of the gross premiums on policies issued during the year on property located in said town, less return premiums, the sum of	25.00
INSURANCE other THAN FIRE OR MARINE, Each insurance company, other than fire or marine company, doing business in the town of Wilsonville, shall pay as a privilege license for doing business in said town, the sum of \$10.00 and \$1.00 on each hundred dollars or major fraction thereof of the gross premiums, less the premiums returned by cancellation, received by it on policies issued during the preceding year to citizens residing within said municipality.

SECTION TWO. That all persons, firms or corporations who shall engage in or carry on any of the trades, businesses or professions hereinabove prescribed or who shall keep, carry on or be engaged in keeping or carrying on of any of the same within the police jurisdiction of said town, but outside the corporate limits thereof, shall be required to pay one-half of the amount shown above as a license tax for the privilege of engaging in or carrying on of said trade or business.

SECTION THREE. That the adoption of this schedule of license shall not abridge the right of the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, to change, alter, increase or decrease or revoke any of the above licenses at any time or when any increase is made unless the same is paid within thirty days after January 1st, the licenses shall be revoked and no further business carried on thereunder, nor shall it abridge the right of the town council to require a license of any business or calling not included in this schedule when such licenses are required, shall be paid for the full year, if begun before July 1st.

SECTION FOUR. This Ordinance shall not apply to any person who is totally blind or who is otherwise under total disability as to manual labor, who employs not to exceed five hundred dollars in capital in said town.

SECTION FIVE. Except as herein specifically provided, all license required in this Ordinance shall be for one year and shall become due the 1st of January of each year and shall be delinquent in the sense in which such term is hereinafter used, if not paid by the 1st of February of each year. All other license shall, unless otherwise provided, become delinquent if not paid before the business is engaged in or the act done for which the same is required.

SECTION SIX. All licenses shall be issued by the Clerk of the Town. There shall be a fee of Fifty cents for the issuance of each license to be paid by the licensee.

SECTION SEVEN. If any person shall become delinquent in the payment of the license required herein, he shall pay a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of the same for each month or fractional part thereof of such delinquency, such penalty to be added to the amount of the license.

SECTION EIGHT. Any person, firm or corporation engaging in or carrying on the business or doing any of the acts for which license is herein required, without first having paid said license, shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than \$100.00 and may also be imprisoned in the Town Jail or sentenced to hard labor for said town for not more than six months. In the event of any appeal and conviction in the Circuit Court, the Judge of said court on the trial of said appeal, shall have the power to impose said jail sentence or sentence to hard labor.

SECTION NINE. Any person making a false affidavit to any statement required herein to be furnished to the Clerk or Mayor, shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, and may also be sentenced to imprisonment or hard labor for the town for not more than six months.

SECTION TEN. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be held by any court to be invalid or illegal, it shall not affect the legality or constitutionality of any other license thereunder.

SECTION ELEVEN. If any license herein levied is by the Court declared unconstitutional, it shall in no way affect the legality or constitutionality of any other license thereunder.

SECTION TWELVE. All ordinance and parts of ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION THIRTEEN. The town of Wilsonville, having a population of less than 2,000 inhabitants, as shown by the last Federal Census, the Town Council elects to give notice of the passage of this Ordinance by posting notices at three public places within the corporate limits of said Town, one of which shall be posted in front of the Mayor's Office or at the United States Post Office.

SECTION FOURTEEN. The provisions of this Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect from year to year unless repealed or amended by subsequent act of the Town Council.

Said Ordinance was read at length and thereupon Councilman R. G. Weaver moved that unanimous consent of the Mayor and Council be given for the immediate consideration of and action upon said Ordinance, which motion was seconded by Councilman S. S. McEwen. Said motion for unanimous consent was submitted to a vote of the Mayor and Council and said vote resulted as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 11A

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

That the Town of Wilsonville has no need for the bank building and the cement block building adjoining and situated immediately west of said bank building for public or municipal purposes and it is to the interest of said Town and its inhabitants for said Town to lease said buildings to the First National Bank of Columbiana so that said bank can establish a branch bank in the Town of Wilsonville under the terms and conditions shown in a copy of the lease hereto attached.

Be it further ordained that the Mayor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into said lease with said Bank by executing said lease, a copy of which is attached hereto
