Councilman Sam Stoudenmire introduced the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 1LA

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. That the regular municipal election in the town of Wilsonville shall be held on the 3rd Monday in September, 1960, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and five memoers of the Town Council, who shall assume the duties of their respective offices on the 1st Monday in October following such election and shall serve for a term of four years.

 $\underline{\texttt{SECTION} \ TWO}. \quad \text{That the voting place of said election shall be in Jack's Hardware Store in Wilsonville, Alabama.}$

SECTION THREE. That the Mayor and Clerk be and they are hereby directed to give notice of said election at least forty days prior to the date of holding the same by posting notice in three public places in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, as provided by law.

SECTION FOUR. That any person desiring to become a candidate at such election may become such a candidate by filing in the Office of the Mayor a statement of candidacy accompanied by affidavit taken or certified by any officer authorized to take acknowledgments in this State; that such person is duly qualified to hold the office for which he desires to become a candidate. Such statement shall be filed at least thirty days before the date set for holding such election and shall be substantially in the following form:

SECTION SIX. That the Mayor shall and he is hereby directed to notify the Inspectors, Clerks, and Returning Officer of their appointment and he is further directed to post a list of them in three public places in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama.

SECTION SEVEN. That the polls shall be opened between the hours of eight and nine o'clock in the morning and kept open without any intermission or adjournment until the hour of six o'clock in the afternoon, and no longer.

SECTION LIGHT. Be it further ordained that this Ordinance be published by posting copies thereof in three public places within the limits of the Town or Wilsonville, Alabama, one of which places shall be at the Post Office or the Mayor's Office of said Town.

SECTION NIME. This Ordinance shall be entitled and shall be cited as, "An ORDINANCE TO CALL A REGULAR MUNICIPAL LLECTION TO BE HELD IN THE TOWN OF WILLCRVILLE, ALABAMA, ON MONDAY, SEFTEMBER 19, FOR THE FURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCILMEN FOR SAID TOWN."

ORDINANCE NO. 15A

BE IT CRUAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF WILLOWVILLE, ALASAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park any motor vehicle for more than two (2) hours at any one time in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, on the following

named street: On the west side of Main Street in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, from a point where the same intersects with the north line of Alabama Highway 25 and extending north to the south line of Church Street in said Town. This parking limit shall be in operation from 7:00 o'clock a.m. to 5:00 o'clock p.m. each day, except for Sundays.

SECTION TWO. Any person, firm or corporation violating the terms of this ordinance shall be fined, upon conviction, \$5.00 for the first offense and not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$25.00 for any subsequent offense.

SECTION THREE. This Ordinance shall take effect after five (5) days from the date of posting of the same.

Said Ordinance was read at length and thereupon Councilman Lee Reinhardt moved that unanimous consent of the Mayor and Council be given for the immediate consideration of, and action upon said Ordinance, which motion was seconded by Councilman Jimmie Morris. Said motion for unanimous consent was submitted to a vote of the Mayor and Council and said vote resulted as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 16A

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. That in the exercise of the police power of the town of Wilsonville and for the purpose of enabling the town of Wilsonville to perform a governmental function, there is hereby fixed the following fees for the collecting, hauling and disposing of garbage and trash for residential or commercial establishments. (a) For each single-family dwelling unit, or business or commercial establishments with the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, seventy-five cents (75¢) per month.

SECTION TWO. That said fees fixed by this ordinance are to be paid by the person in possession or control of the dwelling unit, business or commercial establishments.

ECTION THREE. All bills for services rendered hereunder shall be due and payable monthly and the fees charged hereunder shall be set out on the utility bills for power, water and gas or anyone of them, mailed out by the town of Wilsonville, and such fees shall be paid when the said bill is paid and the said town shall not accept the payment of any utility bill unless the fee for garbage and trash service, hereunder is also paid. All fees collected hereunder shall be net and all accounts shall be considered delinquent if not paid within the time limit specified in the bills so rendered by the town of Wilsonville, Aladama. All delinquent accounts are subject to the same penalties as are now in effect by the town of Wilsonville, Aladama in connection with delinquent accounts for utility services rendered by the said town.

All persons hereafter making application for power, water or gas service in the town of Wisonville shall deposit with said Town a sum equal to the fees hereunder for two months, such deposit to be held as security for the payment of such fees as may become due from the applicant under the terms of this ordinance. If such applicant shall fail to pay such fee or fees as may become due hereunder, the said deposit shall, to the extent necessary, be forfeited and be used to pay to the town such fees as may be due to it from such applicant under the terms of this Ordinance.

All delinquent accounts are subject to stoppage of service without notice. The stoppage of service hereinabove authorized for nonpayment of collection charges shall be in addition of the right of the town to proceed for the collection of such unhand charges provided by law for the collection of a municipal claim.
