

named street: On the west side of Main Street in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, from a point where the same intersects with the north line of Alabama Highway 25 and extending north to the south line of Church Street in said Town. This parking limit shall be in operation from 7:00 o'clock a.m. to 5:00 o'clock p.m. each day, except for Sundays.

SECTION TWO. Any person, firm or corporation violating the terms of this ordinance shall be fined, upon conviction, \$5.00 for the first offense and not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$25.00 for any subsequent offense.

SECTION THREE. This Ordinance shall take effect after five (5) days from the date of posting of the same.

Said Ordinance was read at length and thereupon Councilman Lee Reinhardt moved that unanimous consent of the Mayor and Council be given for the immediate consideration of, and action upon said Ordinance, which motion was seconded by Councilman Jimmie Morris. ORDINANCE NO. 16A

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. That in the exercise of the police power of the town of Wilsonville and for the purpose of enabling the town of Wilsonville to perform a governmental function, there is hereby fixed the following fees for the collecting, hauling and disposing of garbage and trash for residential or commercial establishments. (a) For each single-family dwelling unit, or business or commercial establishments with the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, seventy-five cents (75¢) per month.

SECTION TWO. That said fees fixed by this ordinance are to be paid by the person in possession or control of the dwelling unit, business or commercial establishments.

SECTION THREE. All bills for services rendered hereunder shall be due and payable monthly and the fees charged hereunder shall be set out on the utility bills for power, water and gas or anyone of them, mailed out by the town of Wilsonville, and such fees shall be paid when the said bill is paid and the said town shall not accept the payment of any utility bill unless the fee for garbage and trash service, hereunder is also paid. All fees collected hereunder shall be net and all accounts shall be considered delinquent if not paid within the time limit specified in the bills so rendered by the town of Wilsonville, Alabama. All delinquent accounts are subject to the same penalties as are now in effect by the town of Wilsonville, Alabama in connection with delinquent accounts for utility services rendered by the said town.

All persons hereafter making application for power, water or gas service in the town of Wilsonville shall deposit with said Town a sum equal to the fees hereunder for two months, such deposit to be held as security for the payment of such fees as may become due from the applicant under the terms of this ordinance. If such applicant shall fail to pay such fee or fees as may become due hereunder, the said deposit shall, to the extent necessary, be forfeited and be used to pay to the town such fees as may be due to it from such applicant under the terms of this Ordinance.

All delinquent accounts are subject to stoppage of service without notice. The stoppage of service hereinabove authorized for nonpayment of collection charges shall be in addition to the right of the town to proceed for the collection of such unpaid charges provided by law for the collection of a municipal claim.

SECTION FOUR. No person, firm, association or corporation may use the town dump for the disposal of refuse without first obtaining permission of the town. Any person, firm, association or corporation having the permission of the Town to use the town dump for the disposal of refuse shall pay a fee of \$1.00 to the Town for every load or part thereof.

SECTION FIVE. It shall be unlawful to use garbage cans other than the regular garbage cans not larger than 30 gallons, with the proper lid closed at all times or to place in any garbage or rubbish container any acids or other dangerous liquids or substances which could cause injury to employees of said Town engaged in removing refuse. Leaking and defective garbage cans with sharp or ragged edges likely to injure employees of said Town engaged in removing refuse will not be serviced and said Town shall cause to be placed on such cans a tag marked "condemned."

SECTION SIX. Any person, firm, association or corporation violating any provision of Section 4 or 5 of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$100.00.

SECTION SEVEN. If any clause, sentence, section or provision of this ordinance is held invalid or inoperative, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Said Ordinance was read at length and thereupon Councilman S. S. McEwen moved that unanimous consent of the Mayor and Council be given for the immediate consideration of and action upon said Ordinance, which motion was seconded by Councilman B. E. Cunningham. Said motion for unanimous consent was submitted to a vote of the Mayor and Council and said vote resulted as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 17A

AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND ESTABLISHING SPEED LIMITS AND PARKING REGULATIONS IN THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AND ITS POLICE JURISDICTION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed than forty (40) miles per hour in the following listed zones of the Town:

- (1) On Alabama Highway No. 25 from the west Town limit easterly toward the Town for a distance of 0.80 miles.
- (2) On Alabama Highway No. 25 from the east Town limit westerly toward the Town for a distance of 0.80 miles.
- (3) On County Road No. 61 from the south Town limit northerly toward the Town for a distance of 0.70 miles.
- (4) On County Road No. 61 from the North Town limit southerly toward the Town for a distance of 0.60 miles.

SECTION TWO. No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed than thirty (30) miles per hour in the following listed zones of the Town:

- (1) All other streets and alleys and areas not specifically mentioned or set out herein within the limits of said town.

SECTION THREE. No person shall operate a motor vehicle in any designated area when said prohibited area is properly marked with yellow paint and/or signed.
