

SECTION FOUR. No person, firm, association or corporation may use the town dump for the disposal of refuse without first obtaining permission of the town. Any person, firm, association or corporation having the permission of the Town to use the town dump for the disposal of refuse shall pay a fee of \$1.00 to the Town for every load or part thereof.

SECTION FIVE. It shall be unlawful to use garbage cans other than the regular garbage cans not larger than 30 gallons, with the proper lid closed at all times or to place in any garbage or rubbish container any acids or other dangerous liquids or substances which could cause injury to employees of said Town engaged in removing refuse. Leaking and defective garbage cans with sharp or ragged edges likely to injure employees of said Town engaged in removing refuse will not be serviced and said Town shall cause to be placed on such cans a tag marked "condemned."

SECTION SIX. Any person, firm, association or corporation violating any provision of Section 4 or 5 of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$100.00.

SECTION SEVEN. If any clause, sentence, section or provision of this ordinance is held invalid or inoperative, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Said Ordinance was read at length and thereupon Councilman S. S. McEwen moved that unanimous consent of the Mayor and Council be given for the immediate consideration of and action upon said Ordinance, which motion was seconded by Councilman B. E. Cunningham. Said motion for unanimous consent was submitted to a vote of the Mayor and Council and said vote resulted as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 17A

AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND ESTABLISHING SPEED LIMITS AND PARKING REGULATIONS IN THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AND ITS POLICE JURISDICTION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed than forty (40) miles per hour in the following listed zones of the Town:

- (1) On Alabama Highway No. 25 from the west Town limit easterly toward the Town for a distance of 0.80 miles.
- (2) On Alabama Highway No. 25 from the east Town limit westerly toward the Town for a distance of 0.80 miles.
- (3) On County Road No. 61 from the south Town limit northerly toward the Town for a distance of 0.70 miles.
- (4) On County Road No. 61 from the North Town limit southerly toward the Town for a distance of 0.60 miles.

SECTION TWO. No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed than thirty (30) miles per hour in the following listed zones of the Town:

- (1) All other streets and alleys and areas not specifically mentioned or set out herein within the limits of said town.

SECTION THREE. No person shall operate a motor vehicle in any designated area when said prohibited area is properly marked with yellow paint and/or signed.

SECTION FOUR. In addition to all other provisions of law relating to the speed and operation of motor vehicles in said Town, there is hereby adopted by the said Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, all laws of the State of Alabama and all rules and regulations of the State Highway Department of Alabama pertaining to the control of traffic and motor vehicles on highways, that are misdemeanors under the State laws and a violation of such laws, rules and regulations in the Town of Wilsonville or in the Police jurisdiction thereof, shall be violations of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or may be imprisoned in the municipal jail or sentenced to hard labor for the Town, for a period of not more than ten (10) days; for a second such conviction within one year thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or may be imprisoned in the municipal jail or sentenced to hard labor for the Town for a period not exceeding twenty (20) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION SIX. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION SEVEN. The Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, having a population of less than 2,000 inhabitants, as shown by the last federal census, the Town Council elects to give notice of the passage of this ordinance by posting notices at three public places within the corporate limits of said Town, one of which shall be posted in front of the Mayor's Office or at the United States Post Office.

SECTION EIGHT. Effective date. This ordinance shall become effective at midnight on the _____ day of _____.

GRADE ORDINANCE NO. 4

AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND ESTABLISHING THE GRADE OF THE FOLLOWING STREETS AND PARTS OF STREETS IN THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, VIZ: KENNEDY AVENUE FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH THE CENTER LINE OF HEBB STREET AND EXTENDING EASTERLY 735 FEET TO A POINT IN THE INTERSECTION OF BRELAND AVENUE; BRELAND AVENUE FROM THE CENTER LINE OF BROTHERS AVENUE AND EXTENDING IN A NORTHERLY DIRECTION 1300 FEET TO THE CENTER OF KENNEDY AVENUE; SPEARMAN STREET, BEGINNING AT THE POINT OF INTERSECTION 10 FEET TO THE EAST OF THE CENTER LINE OF ALABAMA HIGHWAY NO. 25 AND EXTENDING IN AN EASTERLY DIRECTION WITH THE MEANDERINGS OF SPEARMAN STREET A DISTANCE OF 1500 FEET TO A POINT; BROTHERS AVENUE, FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH THE CENTER LINE OF HEBB ROAD AND EXTENDING IN AN EASTERLY DIRECTION 2255 FEET TO THE POINT OF ENDING; THAT CERTAIN STREET LEADING FROM ALABAMA HIGHWAY NO. 25 BY THE WATER TANK TO CUNNINGHAM SUBDIVISION, BEGIN 10 FEET EAST OF THE CENTER LINE OF ALABAMA HIGHWAY NO. 25 AND EXTENDING EASTERLY ALONG THE MEANDERINGS OF SAID STREET 540 FEET TO THE EXISTING PAVEMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

That the grades of the following streets and parts of streets in the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, viz: Kennedy Avenue from its intersection with the center line of Hebb Street and extending easterly 735 feet to a point in the intersection of Breland Avenue; Breland Avenue from the center line of Brothers Avenue and extending in a northerly direction 1300 feet to the center of Kennedy Avenue; Spearman Street, beginning at the point of intersection 10 feet to the east of the center line of Alabama Highway No. 25 and extending in an easterly direction with the meanderings of Spearman Street a distance of 1500 feet to a point; Brothers Avenue, from its intersection with the center line of Hebb Road and extending in an easterly direction 2255 feet to the point of ending; that certain street leading from Alabama Highway No. 25 by the water tank to Cunningham subdivision, begin 10 feet east of the center line of Alabama Highway No. 25 and extending easterly along the meanderings of said street
