SPECIAL MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL

The Town Council of the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, met in special session at the Town Hall, the regular place of holding meetings of said Mayor and Council, on the 31st day of December, 1963, at 12:00 o'clock noon. Upon roll call the following were found to be present: Mayor R. G. Stephenson and Councilmen D. F. Bolton, Billy A. Whitten, Lee Reinhardt, George Winston Baker.

Councilman D. F. Bolton introduced the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 19A

AN ORDINANCE  
TO FIX AND PRESCRIBE LICENSE SCHEDULE FOR THE TOWN OF  
WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AND THE POLICE JURISDICTION  
THEREOF, UPON THE HEREINAFTER ENUMERATED  
VOCATIONS, PROFESSIONS, BUSINESSES, TRADES  
OR CALLINGS FOR THE YEAR 1964

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. That all persons, firms or corporations who shall engage in or carry on any of the trades, businesses or professions hereinafter prescribed, or who shall keep, carry on or be engaged in keeping or carrying on any of the trades, businesses, professions or establishments, or to do any of the acts hereinafter specified within the corporate limits of the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, on or after the 1st day of January, 1964, and before January 1, 1965, shall first pay a license tax for the privilege of engaging in or carrying on said trade, business, profession or establishment, or for doing such acts of business within the corporate limits of said Town, and procure a license therefor, such trades, businesses, professions, establishments or acts, and the license therefor shall be as follows:

**SECTION TWO.** That the adoption of this schedule of license shall not abridge the right of the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, to change, alter, increase or decrease or revoke any of the above licenses at any time or when any increase is made unless the same is paid within thirty day the license shall be revoked, and no further business carried on thereunder; nor shall it abridge the right of the Town Council to require a license for any business or calling not included in this schedule, and when such licenses are required shall be paid for the full year, if before July the first.

**SECTION THREE.** Any persons, firms or corporations who shall within the corporate limits of said Town engage in or carry on any trades, businesses, or professions listed in the above schedule, or who shall on or after the 1st day of January, 1964, and before the 1st day of January, 1965, do any business or act for which license is required by this ordinance, without first paying such license tax and procuring a license to engage in said trade, business, or profession, shall on conviction be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars and not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, and may also be imprisoned in the Town Jail or sentenced to hard labor for the Town for not more than ninety days and in the event of conviction in said Circuit Court, the Judge presiding said Court on the trial of said appeal, shall have the power to impose said jail sentence.

**SECTION FOUR.** If any license herein levied is by the Mayor and Council, or a majority, thereof, appears to be unjust, said Mayor and Council or majority thereof may declare said license null and void, and of no effect, by a resolution duly passed and adopted by said Council and the action thereof shall not in any way effect the legality or constitutionality of any other license thereunder.

~~**SECTION FIVE.** If any license herein levied is by any court declared unconstitutional it shall in no way effect the legality or constitutionality of any other license thereunder.~~

**SECTION SIX.** Said Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, having a population of less than two thousand inhabitants, as shown by the last Federal Census, and having no newspaper published in said municipality, notice of the adoption of this Ordinance shall be given by posting notices at three public places within the corporate limits of said town, one of said notices shall be posted at the front of the Mayor's Office, one at the front of the United States Post Office and another at any public place within the corporate limits of the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama.

Councilman D. F. Bolton moved that the rules be suspended and unanimous consent be given for immediate consideration of and action on said ordinance, which motion was seconded by Councilman Billy Whitten, and upon the motion being put to vote, the following vote was recorded:

ORDINANCE NO. 10

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Title 37, Section 404, Code of Alabama 1940, as amended, the Town Council of the Town of Wilsonville, shall consist of a Mayor and five Councilmen who shall be elected from the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, at large by the qualified electors of the City of Wilsonville at general municipal elections to be held on the second Tuesday in August, 1964, and quadrennially thereafter. Such officers elected at said general municipal elections shall commence their terms of office on the first Monday in October following their election and serve for four year terms or until their successors are lawfully chosen and installed in office.

Section 2. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 3 of Act Number 663 of the Regular Session of the Legislature of Alabama, 1961, as amended, the offices of councilmen for the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, are hereby designated by place, as follows: Councilman, Place Number One; Councilman, Place Number Two; Councilman, Place Number Three; Councilman, Place Number Four; Councilman, Place Number Five. Persons qualifying as candidates for the office of Councilman at the general municipal election to be held on the second Tuesday in August, 1964, and quadrennially thereafter, are hereby required to specify the place on the council for which each is a candidate and no person shall be allowed to qualify as a candidate for more than one office on the Council.

Section 3. General municipal elections hereafter held in the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, shall be conducted pursuant to the provisions of Act Number 663, Regular Session of the Legislature of Alabama 1961, as amended.
